We have been hard at work making some changes to ensure your safety and the safety of our staff. Our staff have been trained on the new measures in place and will be in on hand to help you if you have any questions or specific access requirements.

We have installed lots of new signage, including a one-way system through the building and floor markings. Follow signage and instructions from staff.

Entrance and exit will be by the main door only and entrance to the auditorium will be by the back door.

We have lots of hand sanitiser throughout the building; everything will be cleaned thoroughly and regularly (including after every screening).

To protect our staff and other customers we ask that you always wear a face covering whenever you are on your feet inside our building, we also ask that you wear your face covering when in the cinemas.

No food or drink will be on sale, but you are welcome to bring your own snacks and drinks. Please be mindful of others and please also take all rubbish away with you.

Current guidelines (as of 16 October 2020) stipulate a maximum of six people from two households can book sets together (unless a larger number represents a single household). Children aged under 12 will not count toward the limit of six people.
