The Velvet Underground created a new sound that changed the world of music, cementing its place as one of rock and roll's most revered bands. Directed with the era's avant-garde spirit by Todd Haynes (Carol, Velvet Goldmine), this kaleidoscopic oral history combines exclusive interviews with dazzling archival footage. It's the first major film to tell the band's legendary story.

Balloon

Pema Tsenden | China | 2019 | 102 mins | 12A | In Chinese and Tibetan with English subtitles

In Tibetan director Pema Tsenden's (Soul Searching, Tharlo, Jinpa) multi award-winning Balloon, a family struggles against the conflicting dictates of nature, spirituality, politics, and free will.

Dargye and Drolkar's two boisterous youngest sons have blown up their parents' condoms like balloons. Not only does this outrage the entire village in Tibet in the early 1980s, but more practically: they have no more condoms. The shepherd couple already have three sons, and as China has recently introduced its one-child policy, they can't have any more. But Dargye is as lustful as one of his stud rams, so some form of contraception is essential.
